Stepping up to Fight Pediatric Cancer

On April 14th Hennessey's Tavern, the St. Baldrick's event team and the Seal Beach Lions jointly produced the most successful pediatric cancer fundraiser in the ten-year history of the event. General Manager Susan Ariano said, "we were so thankful for the support of the Lions, the incredible attendance and engagement by all the members of the St. Baldrick's, Miller's Children's Hospital and CHOC teams." She continued, "over the last ten years, we have raised at this location alone, over \$360,000 to fight cancer in kids, with over \$80,000 raised in this year alone."

The mission of St Baldrick's is simple. From their website, it says, "kids with cancer are our reason for it all. They're the inspiration behind our event and the reason we're helping fund childhood cancer research. We believe all kids should be able to grow up and turn their dreams into realities." The St. Baldrick's Foundation is a volunteer-powered charity that funds more in childhood cancer research grants than any organization except the U.S. government.

According to the funding page at press time, \$82,563 was raised by individual donors, silent auction, sponsorships, vendors and business contributions. Wholly staffed by volunteers, 100% of the proceeds from the event go to fight pediatric cancer. The lead oncology nurse, Kristen & her family, along with dozens of nurses and staff from Miller's and families of those with "angel" children who are no longer with us, and those in treatment worked all day to cheer on those being shaved, show support and share experiences of how each of us can make a difference. Also on hand were many superheroes to keep the kids smiling. Congratulations to everyone who showed up and continued to fundraise for the cause.

Lions Serve at Seal Beach Classic Car Show


