

While the weather was less than perfect the weekend of July 20 and 21, the 69th Annual Fish Fry was still a success.

Year after year, this event brings people together at Eisenhower Park to enjoy food, sun, music and fun while supporting the Lions club and the surrounding community.

With plenty of seating, room for dancing and room for drinking, people had a wonderful time.

The new layout worked very well and kept the food area from being overcrowd-ed.

During the weekend, guests consumed approximately 5,600 beers, 2,600 fish dinners and 2,500 drinks.

Thousands heard music from a great lineup of bands including Dangerous Stranger, Soccer Moms, Robby Armstrong, Persons of Interest, Ty G and the Firestorm, Danny Dean, The Losers and Joe Schmoe.


