Yet most young children don't get their vision screened until they have problems learning or paying attention in school. By then, it may already be too late. Unless vision problems are detected early and corrected, they risk becoming permanent by age 7.


BREAKFAST WITH SANTA By chairman Bob Ripple

Lions Support Ronald McDonald House By Chairman Ellen Liebherr


An efficient team of Lions prepared dinner at the Long Beach Ronald McDonald House for about 40 guests with sick children at nearby Miller Children's Hospital.
