Veterans Corner:



Did you ever watch Black Sheep Squadron? Heard of Greg "Pappy" Boyington? Well here is his story and how he was awarded the Medal of Honor in 1942.

Major Boyington led a formation of twenty-four fighters over Kahili on 17 October. Persistently circling the airdome where sixty hostile aircraft were grounded, he boldly challenged the Japanese to send up planes. Under his brilliant command, our fighters shot down twenty enemy craft in the ensuing action without the loss of a single ship.

A superb airman and determined fighter against overwhelming odds, Major Boyington personally destroyed 28 of the many Japanese planes shot down by his squadron and by his forceful leadership developed combat readiness in his command which was a distinctive factor in the Allied aerial achievements in this strategic area. Boyington was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor and Navy Cross by President Roosevelt.
