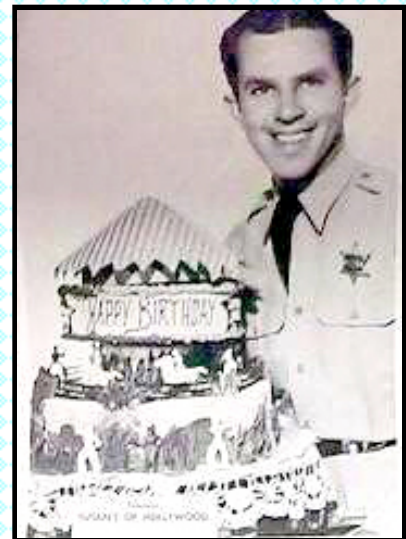

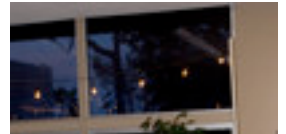

SBPD EMERGENCY RESPONSE DRILL

The Seal Beach Police Department reached out to the Seal Beach Lions and Leos to be part of their 2011 Emergency Response Drill. The drill simulated looking for a missing person and canvassing the entire Seal Beach neighborhood to look for the victim. In this exercise, SBPD tested their effectiveness in checking in volunteers, feeding volunteers, how their communication systems worked, how their management teams worked, and many other things. They also had organized teams of four to canvass sections of the city to pass out flyers to each residence.

Eleven of our Seal Beach Lions participated, including Brad Barras, Laura Ellsworth, Ray Longoria, Katherine McHugh, Meagan McHugh, Teri Newton, Cathy and Scott Newton, Les Shobe, Guy Shurki and Gary Snow. Fifteen Leos also participated. The Emergency Services Coordinator and the Acting Police Chief both commented that they could not have conducted the drill without the help of our 26 volunteers. They also commented that they would like to discuss the possibility of adding our organization to their emergency response team.

Seal Beach Lions felt that the exercise was a lot of walking, but that the project was rewarding and loved serving their community. They were happy that this was just a drill and that no one was really missing.
