Nine Seal Beach Lions and one prospective member provided much needed help at the CLFIS sight clinic in Riverside on Saturday, February 23, 2013.

Some Lions arrived as early as 7:15 a.m. to help with setup and others stayed to the end.

Lions helped people register and check in, measured prescriptions with the refractometers, acted as runners, worked on the computers, searching for available eyeglasses and worked at the end of the line where people get their new glasses.

New Lion Diana Oliveras, her friend and Lion Maria De La Cueva helped immensely by being bilingual.

More than 400 people received the gift of sight from the Lions by getting recycled or new eyeglasses.

In addition to working hard all day, President Ellen presented CLFIS with a donation of \$2,000. President Ellen also did a great job with eyeglass distribution and her Spanish improved greatly as the day went on.

Lions Scott and Cathy Newton worked the California Lions Friends in Sight [CLFIS] eye clinic in Moorpark on Saturday, February 16.

Lions from Moorpark, Simi Valley, Beaumont, Calimesa and Rancho Cucamonga took part in a clinic where nearly 200 patients were served.

Because it was slow and there were plenty of volunteers, Lion Scott took the opportunity to go through the entire clinic like everyone else.

The clinic stations include: 1) registration 2) prescription reading 3) glaucoma test 3) doctor's exam 4) eyeglass selection and testing 5) eyeglass adjustments and cleaning 6) check out and selection of glass cases.

The total process took nearly 40 minutes and he came away with a great pair of eyeglasses.

You just never know how our work will affect the people in our community. I recently received an unexpected letter from a name that I didn't recognize—Jerrie Chapin. Upon opening the envelope a \$100 check fell out. Reading the note accompanying it explained it all.

I'll start with a little history. Up until 1986, Lions Clubs were all men. Ladies were non-voting members of an auxiliary called Lioness Clubs. In 1988, a number of local ladies decided to form the Seal Beach Lioness Club. A few years later, the Lioness Club changed over to a Lions Club. The Seaside Lions were an active group but made a decision after a number of years to turn in their charter and combine membership with the Seal Beach Lions. Many of our female members are transfers from this club.

Jerrie Burton Chapin was one of the charter members of the Lioness Club. She and her husband Roger lived on Seal Way and were friends to many of us. When Roger became ill, Jerrie resigned as a member. After his passing, Jerrie took advantage of the city's offer to purchase a bench in his honor.

Jerrie's letter thanking our club for our bench refurbishment project confirms how deeply we affect people in this fine city. Thank you Lions Laura Ellsworth and Camille Romano for chairing this project and to all of the Lions who gave hours of service to make the benches look as good as new. What a TEAM!
