

On October 20th, Seal Beach Lions were honored with a special treat, a visit from Congressman Dana Rohrabacher.

At our club's request, the congressman kept away from politics and told us about himself personally.

Club members enjoyed hearing about his childhood traveling with his family in the military and young adulthood as he grew up in the South Bay.

Rohrabacher told the club that spent in young adulthood in the South Bay on the Palos Verdes Peninsula.

His father, who was retired military, hit a period of financial difficulty.

Rohrabacher worked at Marineland, a tourist attraction in Palos Verdes that was located where the Terranea Resort is now standing.

He attended Harbor College and Long Beach State University.

He loved surfing around the South Bay, Seal Beach, Huntington Beach and Newport.

Rohrabacher also relayed how he started his early career in politics.

As a graduate student at USC, Rohrabacher campaigned for Ronald Reagan to win the governorship of California.

His group was called "Youth for Reagan."

When the election was won, his group was disbanded and Rohrabacher was extremely disappointed.

Due to lack of security at that period in time, Rohrabacher drove up to Reagan's home, which was then located in Pacific Palisades, CA, to make a plea to keep the group intact.

He spent the night in Reagan's backyard, hoping to catch a few moments' audience with the newly elected governor.

Nancy Reagan spotted the camper in her yard and promised him a meeting with a campaign director if he would be on his way.

Rohrabacher, satisfied with the meeting, was headed down the driveway, when he heard a voice behind him.

"Young man, young man, just a minute," Reagan called. He told Rohrabacher that anyone who could spend a night in his backyard deserved a few moments of his time.

Rohrabacher later went on to work for Reagan.

Rohrabacher's career started out in journalism, and worked its way into speech writing and eventually politics.

Rohrabacher told our club that he loves freedom and admires people with strong beliefs that care about others. This is why he likes Lions Clubs.

Rohrabacher went on to talk about the Reagan Doctrine, which believes it is important to "Help the enemies of our enemies." In this way, we let others fight the enemy for us.

In 1988 the day after the November election, Rohrabacher went to Afghanistan and stayed for one week, fighting in a gully.

He felt that as president, George H.W. Bush did not feel loyalty to the Afghan people; therefore, Saudi Arabia and Pakistan helped Afghanistan and the Taliban developed.

A close military friend of Rohrabacher's was murdered in September of 2001. Rohrabacher was on call to see Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice to warn that this murder was a sign of an impending terrorist attack on the United States. more....

Rohrabacher feels that capitalism and freedom don't just mean the ability for us to make money. He feels it is the pursuit of happiness and the freedom to do good and to make the community a better place.
