Nearly everything was gone from every room in this large home. The only this of value left in the home was Lois's pet poodle 'Duke' who had been left without food and water for 4 days.

Of course the police were called along with social workers but there were no agencies that could come to Lois's rescue and get her situated in her home. Lion Nikki called the Seal Beach Lions Club for help.

Within an hour of receiving the call, Lions were at Lois's home assessing the situation and dividing up the work load. Lion Nikki purchased food, Lion Cathy purchased linens and other household items, and Lion Scott purchased new locks to secure the home. Beds for Lois and her caregiver were provided by hospice but they had no sheets, blankets or pillows. In addition to the items purchased, Lions also donated a towels, toiletries, lightbulbs, tinsels, cups, TP, pillows, and blankets.

ran old TV was found and Lions Scott & Nikki brought over DVD's. Within 3 hours of arriving on the scene, the home was secure, the beds were made, makeshift end tables and lamps were in place, Lois and Duke were fed, and the home was livable again.

Lions gave of their time, their treasure, their talents and their hearts for a complete stranger in need. That's what we do – We Serve.

I am proud to call Lion Scott, Lion Cathy, Lion Nikki Seal beach Lions. I would like to welcome all of our new lions, and say there are so many events you can get involved with just ask. We will help you serve.



Sometimes we never know when our services as a Lion will be needed. Such was the case on September 8th, when Lion Nikki Illingworth was escorting an elderly woman named Lois home from the hospital.

Lois had recently been hospitalized due to a fall, but had recovered enough to return to her nice home in the City of Cypress. Nikki and one of Lois' caretakers assisted her home under hospice care.

Imagine the shock they received when they opened the door and Lois's home was almost completely empty, including Lois' bed.

One of the only things remaining was Duke, Lois' pet poodle, who had been left without food and water for four days.

Police and social workers were called to assist, but there were no local agencies to get Lois situated in her home. Lion Nikki called Seal Beach Lions Club for help.

An hour later Seal Beach Lions were at Lois' door, assessing the situation and dividing up the work. Lion Nikki purchased food, Lion Cathy Newton purchased linens and household items, and Lion Scott Newton purchased new locks to secure the home.

Beds had been supplied by hospice, but there were no sheets, pillows or blankets. In addition to these purchased items, Lions donated towels, toiletries, light bulbs, cups and toilet paper.

The next day, Duke was taken to the groomer and it was paid with using a gift certificate won at Fish Fry! Duke was happy to be clean, but he couldn't wait to be reunited with Lois when he was brought home.

Even though Lois' home was not the same, it was made secure and comfortable by the Seal Beach Lions Club. Seal Beach Lions gave to a complete stranger in a time of need and lived up to our motto – We Serve.





Angie Kardashian "A Call To Serve"

At the September 21st meeting, Seal Beach Lions were treated to a guest speaker who is a true American patriot, Angie Kardashian.

Although she is as pretty as one of the TV Kardashian sisters, her calling has a more patriotic nature.

As the owner of Angie's Cuisine Italiano Restaurant in Tustin in 1980, she was located near the former Marine Corps Air Station in Tustin and El Toro Marine Base. Her restaurant became a popular destination for Marines and their families.

Angie was in New York on August 4, 2001, visiting friend Lt. General Fred McCorkle, just a month before the planes hit the Twin Towers and the Pentagon. She had visited all three buildings on her trip.

Wanting to help in some way, Angie sold her restaurant and refinanced her home. With the support of her pastor, Rev. Rick Warren, author of "The Purpose Driven Life," Angie set out to New York City to see how she could help.

She determined that her calling was a "cooking ministry" and she went from fire station to fire station, cooking for fire fighters as they retrieved casualties from the debris at Ground Zero.

Angie learned of the losses of these men over the dinner table and bonded with them as they told the stories of the brothers, fathers, and sons that walked into the World Trade Center, never to come out.

Angie keeps the spirit of these men alive and makes sure that no one will forget the people who gave their lives on September 11, 2001.
