Seal Beach Lions Club Honors 2017 Melvin Jones Fellowship Recipients

The Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) is the charitable arm of Lions Clubs International. 100% of all money donated supports 4 categories of giving.

- We give *SIGHT*: LCIF helps to restore sight and prevent blindness by improving eye care.
- We support YOUTH: Through Lions Quest and other projects youth enjoy opportunities to develop and succeed.
- We provide **DISASTER RELIEF:** LCIF is committed to immediate and long-term assistance.
- We meet **HUMANITARIAN NEEDS:** Programs improve health, fight measles and provide aid to the disables and hearing impaired.

This summer, the world watched as natural disasters struck around the world. In South Asia, parts of India, Nepal and Bangladesh are experiencing devastating monsoon rains. In Mumbai alone, over 1,000 people have been reported killed in the floods. In the past 3 months, LCIF has approved 20 emergency grants to South Asia, totaling US\$125,000. In July, flooding in Japan took lives and destroyed homes. LCIF awarded a US\$100,000 Major Catastrophe Grant to help the community recover.

In August, Hurricane Harvey devastated the Texas coast stretching from the Houston area into Louisiana. During one of the worst natural disasters in American history, thousands of people lost their homes and everything they own. Some people lost family members. LCIF immediately awarded a US\$100,000 Major Catastrophe Grant to assist in reconstruction efforts. Within two weeks of Hurricane Harvey, Hurricane Irma struck Florida and other areas of the Southeast United States, and destroyed much of the islands in the western Atlantic Ocean and Caribbean Sea. At the same time, Mexico was hit by its strongest earthquake in 100 years. LCIF has made funds available for two more US\$100,000 grants to aid Lions assisting with Hurricane Irma and Mexico's earthquake. Most recently, LCIF awarded a US\$100,000 grant to support Puerto Rico hurricane relief and reconstruction in the wake of Hurricane Maria.

This year the Seal Beach Lions made an \$10,000 donation to LCIF designating funds be used for disaster relief. By doing this we were able to select 10 members, honoring them with a Melvin Jones Fellowship Award. This Fellowship Award (LCIF) recognizes outstanding individuals by bestowing on them an award that is named for its founder, Melvin Jones. It is the highest form of recognition and embodies humanitarian ideas consistent with the nature and purpose of Lionism. Meet your 2016-2017 Melvin Jones Fellows:


LION BOB RIPPLE

A Message From President Seth

One of my favorite characters in the world of literature is A. A. Milne's, Winne the Pooh. In Pooh's Little Instruction Book, inspired by Pooh, is the statement, "If the person you are talking to doesn't appear to be listening, be patient. It may simply be that he has a small piece of fluff in his ear."

In life, can't you remember a time when you wanted to be understood, and the person you were saying something significant to just did not seem to be listening? I know it has happened to me on more than one occasion. In each case, I told myself a story about WHY the other person wasn't listening, even if in fact they were and I just refused to accept that they were. Nearly every time I was wrong, and a different real story, like the "small piece of fluff in his ear" or something similar, was the reality.



During this time of always-on social media, divisive political discussion, aggressive political correctness, hate speech, relentless news, connected devices which surround us and demand our attention to "urgent" matters, I would encourage all of us to listen more. The surveys of both our club's board and general membership (a copy of which in included in this issue of the Growl) was a way of hearing from you. Some Lions are accustomed, myself as one of the worst offenders, to always be talking, which to some (including ourselves often) appears like leadership.

So far, many of my most profound insights have occurred by listening to my fellow Lions. Listening is praised as an agent of change in the world of science and research. Jane Goodall, the world-renowned primatologist, and anthropologist noted, "Change happens by listening and then starting a dialogue with the people who are doing something you don't believe is right."

Every Lion and Leo should not only listen but should come and share their feelings as they might feel the need to leadership. I know I am looking, listening and trying to feel my best way through, though occasionally, I do have a bit of fluff in my ears, so be patient with me and others.


