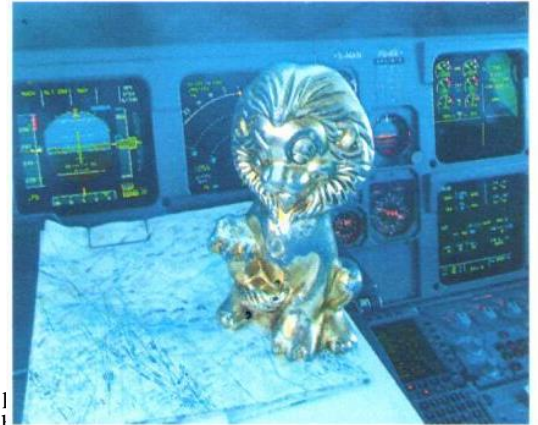

Just in September, we have continued to execute on our relentless calendar. Here are a few of the things which you may or may not know we are moving forward with or have completed:

- We produced for the second year, the now annual Arts & Crafts Faire. This event which took dozens of Lions and Leos generated over \$20,000 in gross revenue, showcased 105 vendors, showcased many of our school district student musical talents and enjoyed a spontaneous, breathtakingly good performance of our National Anthem by Chance Perez, winner of the ABC's first season of Boy Band.
- Through the partnership with Jessica Jacobs and the City of Seal Beach recreation department, a beautiful Chalk Art component to the Arts & Crafts Faire continued, with the Lions Club International Peace Poster Contest lead by Lion Barbara Wright.
- New member orientation and happy hour mixers beautifully set up and produced by Membership Chair Laura Ellsworth and supported by Lion Scott Newton. Special thanks to Lion Jack Deaton and Glory Days for the food and venue!
- The activation and meeting of all five of our currently sponsored LEO clubs – Seal Beach, VBA, The Youth Center, Cypress High School, and the Braille Institute. A huge shout out to all the LEO advisors and Lions who continue to mentor and support our youth.
- The appointment of Art Fry as the new Chair of the Military Affairs Committee (MAC) who, with Lion Les Shobe and Pastor Bob from Grace Community Church is going to take over the Veteran's & Memorial Day ceremony in Eisenhower Park in partnership with the American Legion Post. Lion Art also has plans for on-going engagement with our military and is being supported by Lion Margie and her attendance to the Regional Military Affairs Committee (RMAC).
- Through a partnership with Save Our Beach and fellow Lion Steve Masoner, who is also the recipient of Cypress College's Americana Citizen of the Year for Seal Beach, we supported the International Coastal Clean-up Day on September 16th. This was coordinated by Lion Deb Machen and Peggy Senneff with 500+ volunteers who showed up to clean Seal Beach and the San Gabriel River trail. Plus, we got to hang out with President Joey Amaro of the Upland Lions and plan our visitation to his club on November 20th to drag queen bingo!
- We attended and supported our sister organization, the Chamber of Commerce for their Installation Breakfast at Old Ranch – congratulations on a great two years of leadership, Lion Tom Rowe, and welcome Lion Scott Levitt into your new presidency.
- Coordination and the beginnings of the International Convention 2018 planning in Las Vegas through Lion Cathy Newton and her team.
- Re-imagining and organization of the garage and three containers through the vision of Lion Jim Whittaker, Mark Kavanaugh, and Scott Newton
- A great board retreat on September 25th which resulted in many actions, one of note, the appointment of the President of the VBA & Seal Beach LEOs to the Seal Beach Lions Board of Directors as advisory members.
- A detailed board survey which in turn yielded a larger study for the entire membership that you will hopefully see, take, and then hear more about those findings.
- Visitations at the Tustin Host Lions, the Huntington Beach Lions, the LEO Advisor and officer training, the Orange Region meeting, and other district Lion meetings through our Visitation chair, Jim Whittaker and Zone chair, Marcella McSorley.

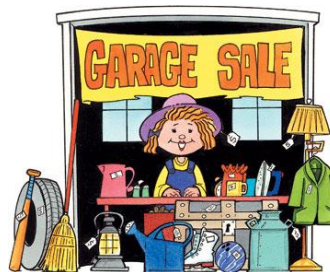
The Seal Beach Lions have at least two major clean up days per years where Lions and Leos clean up the riverbeds, a favorite area for taggers.
